



Materials List-The Beginners Guide to Painting

You must have all your equipment in time to begin the first class.

All students must bring the following to class—

- Canvas or canvas board or canvas pad.
- Approximately 16 inches x 14 inches. Available quite cheaply at some \$2 type shops and art shops. Prices vary.
- Soft leaded pencil. Eraser.
- Large empty glass jar or honey bucket. Palettes. These can be the lids from takeaway meals or picnic plates. One is not enough. Bring plenty.
- Old cotton rag.
- A few sheets of newspaper to protect tables.

Brushes:

- 1 short handled hog hair brush **OR** a household brush 1-2 inches in width. (Doesn't have to be new.)
- Flat bristle brushes. Please look for the brushes with a pine-look, polished handle. Sizes:12, 9, 5. Or similar. Often available cheaply at newsagents. \$1-\$2.
- 1 Taklon Brush. Round. Size 4 or 5. Fibres should be snowy white. About \$9 in art shops. Also Lincraft and Spotlight. This is for fine detail work.
- Optional-Rigger brush. Size 4.

Paints:

Please buy either Chromacryl or A2 paints (or artist quality paints if you can afford them.)

Other cheap paints are not acceptable due to their often overwhelming smell, which can cause illness in others, including the teacher. This is a health and safety issue. The teacher will be using Chromacryl paints.
